

Here’s what’s a “Buzz” in First Grade!



First graders continue to learn how to **bee** good citizens by **beeing** responsible. They read about Brother Bear (of the Beristain Bear fame) who didn’t take his responsibility at school and then he had to face the consequences of earning a failing grade on his math test. Unlike Brother Bear, Cinderella was **beeing** very responsible doing all the household chores without complaining. Even though Cinderella is a fairytale, first graders learned that taking your responsibility and doing your best paid off for Cinderella. She was rewarded and became a princess and got to live in a palace!! To complete our character study on **beeing** responsible first graders studied the biblical story of Moses.
